



MAYOR'S YOUTH COUNCIL APPLICATION

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications will be accepted from **January 1st – August 21st** of each year. They are available on the City's website and from the Community Relations Department, 214 N. Center Street, Goldsboro. Applications are only accepted during this period.

An ad hoc committee of the Community Affairs Commission will make the final determination of prospected members.

Mayor's Youth Council members are mandated to participate in the 2 major scholarship fundraisers: December – gift wrapping (last 2 weeks before Christmas) and another fundraiser (TBD) in March/April

The information above gives you a general idea of some activities and dates. Please give these responsibilities serious consideration in your decision to complete this application.

Youth Council Applications: (Depending upon open vacancies and school's diversity)

- Applications will be accepted from the following high schools: Charles B. Aycock, Eastern Wayne, Goldsboro, Rosewood, Southern Wayne, Spring Creek, Wayne Christian, Wayne Country Day, Wayne Early Middle College, and Wayne School of Engineering. Eight students will be selected from each school. Only 1 student will represent Home School students.
- Must apply during the 8th, 9th, 10th or 11th grade to serve during the next school year
- Must submit application plus two indicated recommendation letters in a seal envelopes by **August 21st** of each year (**late applications will not be considered**). If the 21st falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday will be the deadline.

Youth Council Members:

- Will receive an acceptance letter in August of each year
- A student may serve up to 4 years (depending upon year of acceptance and GYC by-laws)
- Will adhere to the City Ordinances, Mayor's Youth Council By-Laws, State Youth Council Code of Ethic and other responsibilities listed on the application
- The first meeting will be held the first Wednesday in September
- If vacancy issues arise during the appointment of members to the Mayor's Youth Council, then siblings will not serve on the Youth Council together. Students with graduating siblings on the Council may be required to reapply the following year.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: The Mayor's Youth Council membership is an important commitment to serving the youth of Goldsboro and Wayne County. In order to have a well-rounded understanding of how students receive community service hours; attendance is required in September for orientation. A parent orientation will be held in September or October of each year.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT (cont.)

2. Why do you want to be a member of the Mayor's Youth Council?

3. The Mayor's Youth Council volunteers in the community every month and there are two mandated fundraisers. How can we be assured you are ready to be an active member?

4. What unique qualities would you bring to the Council?

Two letters of recommendation are required (from either an elected official, principal, teacher or guidance counselor) and should accompany your application

NOTE: Often applications are received from teens looking simply to add a community or volunteer project to a college application or resume, without a real interest in participation. This is frowned upon and should an overwhelming amount of applications come from a particular high school, selections will be reviewed very carefully. In addition, we are looking for a diverse group of students from each of the 10 high schools and 1 home school (Charles B. Aycock, Eastern Wayne, Goldsboro, Rosewood, Southern Wayne, Spring Creek, Wayne Christian, Wayne Country Day, Wayne Early Middle College, and Wayne School of Engineering) in Wayne County. All meetings are held at City Hall, City Council Chambers, 214 N. Center Street, Goldsboro, NC 27530.
