Downtown Development, community partners launching entrepreneurship program

Downtown Goldsboro

Launch is designed to equip local entrepreneurs with knowledge and greater access to capital.

The City of Goldsboro's Downtown Development Department is one of several community partners working together to introduce an entrepreneurship development program called Launch, designed to accelerate business start-ups and business growth. The program will kickoff in January 2020.

"The aim of Launch is to grow the capacity of entrepreneurs through education, support and capital," said Scott Satterfield, Downtown Development business & property development specialist. "A large group of community partners have reached an agreement to work together to support this initiative that we feel will be a real growth for the city and the county. Not only will Launch help entrepreneurs by equipping them with knowledge, but also working to carve out greater access to capital. We are confident this program is one small way to begin to position our community to thrive in a very competitive market for jobs and resources in the months and years ahead."

Launch program participants will attend an eight-week program that will include a series of 10 Small Business Center seminars at Wayne Community College and five group mentoring sessions. At the end of the program, participants will have an opportunity to pitch their business to a panel. The entrepreneur with the winning pitch will receive a financial award for their business.

The partners working to make Launch happen are: Downtown Goldsboro Development Corporation; City of



Goldsboro Downtown Development Department; East Carolina University Miller School of Entrepreneurship; Small Business Center (Wayne Business and Industry Center at Wayne Community College); University of Mount Olive Tillman School of Business; Wayne Community College; Wayne County Chamber of Commerce; Wayne County Library Entrepreneur Learning Center; and the Wayne County Development Alliance.




