We're moving past the hottest summer on record into the cooler days of fall, and soon we'll be into winter. This hurricane season, we have been blessed, so far, to avoid any significant damages from the numerous tropical storms and hurricanes that have made their way along our Carolina coast. Let's be thankful for that!

Goldsboro continues to grow in terms of new businesses and residential development. We have seen the largest expansion of residential construction (planned and underway) in many years. Newcomers to Goldsboro are selecting our city to relocate from areas of high housing costs and living expenses. New residents are moving here from Wake and Johnston counties, as well as other areas within the state. It's interesting how many times I meet individuals who have moved here from out of state because they have researched places to relocate and chose Goldsboro as their final choice. Yard and Bulk Waste Service Reminders

Leaves:

- Make sure to rake leaves into a pile at the curb no later than the night before the scheduled recycle day.
- Due to heavier volumes during leaf season, there may be possible delays to the normal schedules.

Bulk Waste:

- Bulk waste pick up service is provided to residential customers with active water accounts and is a FREE service.
- Bulk waste pick up is limited to no more than six items per pick up address.
- Residents must call ahead to schedule a pick up prior to the pickup day.
- Bulk waste pick up is provided weekly on Wednesdays unless it is a holiday week. Bulk waste will not be collected during the week of a holiday.
